RADIATION SAFETY FOR PENNSYLVANIA DENTAL PROFESSIONALS

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

A thorough understanding of the principals of radiation is critical to patient and staff safety. The purpose of this course is to identify and review the applicable Pennsylvania radiation safety regulations for dental professionals, including the requirements of Pennsylvania Code

Title 25 §221.11. The Refresher Training topics listed in "Appendix A" will be discussed, such as the properties of radiation, hazards and effects; and radiation protection methods and procedures.

COURSE OBJECTIVES:

- At the conclusion of the seminar, the participant will be able to: Explain the Pennsylvania radiology regulations governing the training of dental professionals
- Describe the sources of radiation exposure, biological affects, and methods of radiation protection; and
- Apply this knowledge of radiation safety to patient imaging.
